The Heathens Support Community with Sensational Soups

When Vera Hartley lay awake worrying about all the people losing their jobs because of COVID-19 she came up with an ingenious solution she's more than happy to help other groups take up. Why not assisst people, who often have little cooking experience, become more independent by giving them the ingredients and recipes to make their own fresh healthy soups?

She suggested the idea to Chris Wheeler, who runs the Heathens Choir. As they were all in Lockdown with time to spare the Heathens embraced the idea and Julie Brackenreg stepped up to help bring the idea to fruition.

Around 14 Heathens now buy a few extra ingredients every time they go shopping and these are bagged up with a recipe and distributed to Blackheath Area Neighbourhood Centre, Belong Blue Mountains Katoomba and Mid Mountains Neighbourhood Centres, and Thrive in Katoomba. The instructions for the vegetarian and vegan soups are very simple and feedback is that the soups and recipes are delicious and have been very welcome as an increasing number of people queue up for food packs.
